Drury's Hammons School of Architecture offers a five-year, accredited Master of Architecture degree. The HSA program combines solid technical and professional education with the personalized setting of a small liberal arts university. We offer many opportunities for dual majors and minors in fields ranging from fine arts to business and computer science. All students participate in community-engagement studios, study-abroad programs, and professional internships.

Transfer of the following courses will fulfill the first year of the two-year lower division of the HSA program, and is contingent upon transcript and portfolio review, as well as letters of recommendation and all other requirements for transfer admission to Drury University. Application to the HSA three-year upper division is made at the end of the second year.
